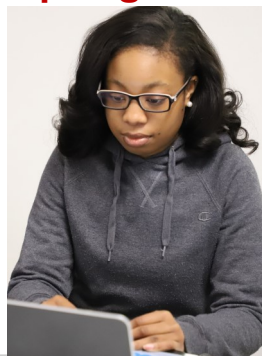


On Going Need: Men's jeans, men's shirts, men's underwear, backpacks and bags of any kind.
